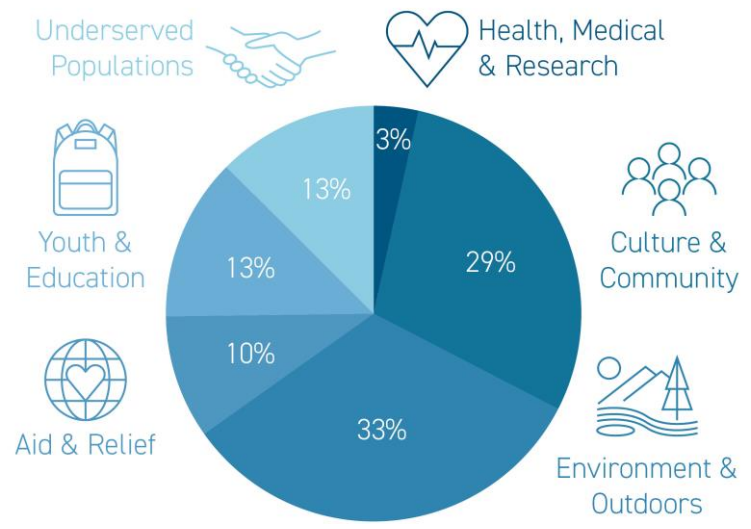

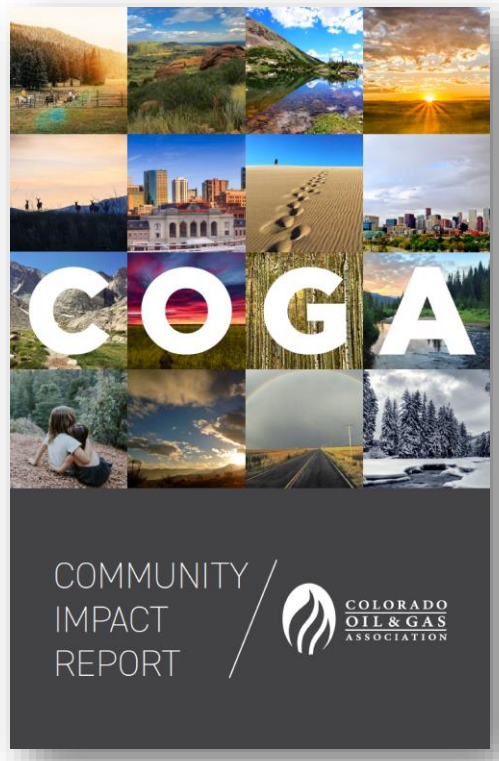
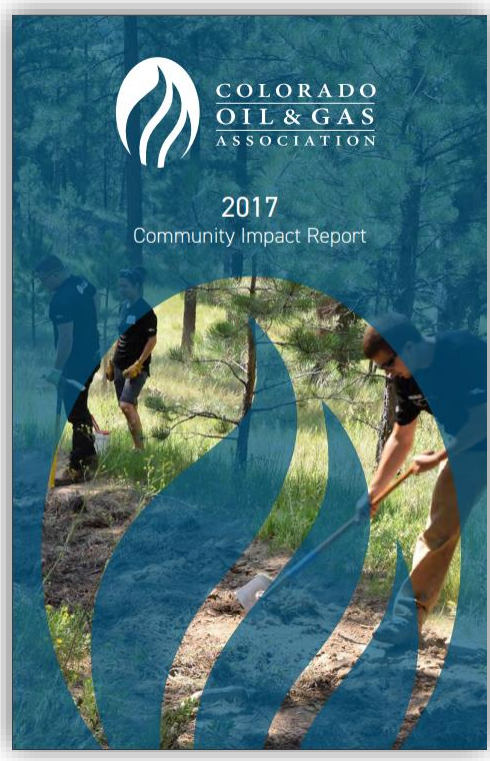
Helping Local Schools



Even Coloradans that don't directly benefit from the oil and gas industry's charitable giving benefit from the taxes paid by the industry. Over the past decade, Colorado operators have paid an average of \$134 million a year in severance taxes, which is money used to support school districts, municipalities, and water projects throughout the state. Oil and natural gas operators also pay more than \$350 million annually in the form of ad valorem taxes that benefit local school districts. Finally, the Colorado State Land Board owns 4 million acres of subsurface mineral rights, which also generate more than \$100 million annually for Colorado schools.
